**NSCD CELEBRATES 50 YEARS OF THE WELLS FARGO SKI CUP,
RAISING \$932,500 TO SUPPORT ADAPTIVE RECREATION PROGRAMS**

DENVER (March 2, 2026) – The National Sports Center for the Disabled (NSCD) announced today that the 50th Annual Wells Fargo Ski Cup (WFSC), held February 19–21 at Winter Park Resort, raised more than \$932,500 to support year-round adaptive recreation and competitive programs for children and adults living with disabilities.

“This milestone year was especially meaningful as we celebrated five decades of partnership, community, and athletic excellence during a Winter Paralympic year,” said Julie Taulman, president and CEO of the NSCD. “We are grateful for the continued support of Wells Fargo, Winter Park Resort, and the many sponsors, athletes, families, and volunteers who make this event possible. The funds raised will help us provide life-changing outdoor experiences for thousands of participants throughout the year.”

More than 3,000 attendees joined the three-day celebration, which featured the Toyota World Disabled Invitational: Winner – Tom Overton; the AEC Challenge: Winner – JHL Constructors; the Corporate Challenge: Winner – Wells Fargo; and the Kids Snowplow Sprint where kids race on the same course as the adults, and a special 50th anniversary Snow Boot Soiree was hosted.

This year’s event also included two additional contributions:

- Wells Fargo and Colorado’s Front Range Toyota Stores partnered to donate a 2026 Toyota Tundra to support NSCD’s programs and operations
